The two bills which received the most attention were SB 3090 relating to the Mauna Kea Management Authority and SB 2593 relating to feeding cats.

For SB 3090, Trustees wanted to know why OHA was not named as a member. JD did not have an answer, but she would check.

For SB 2593, a trustee mentioned that feral cats and the feeding of feral cats is a real problem in the neighborhood. Allowing people to feed the cats may not be the answer. Euthanization may be the answer.
