A. 2018 OHA Legislative Package Updates – Matrix 2

KC calls on Jocelyn Doane (JD) and Wayne Tanaka (WT) to present item III. A.

JD begins by sharing that HB 1747 and SB 2136 made it out of their committees. SB 2133 passed out of a triple referral and needs to go before the Senate Committee on Commerce, Consumer Protection, and Health (CPH). Both HB 1746 and SB 2135 should be meeting their deadlines. The training bills are also moving.

JD shares that OHA still needs to continue talking to legislators about the Public Land Trust bills, but the bills seem to be moving forward.

KP suggests moving on to item IV. A.

JD and WT present Matrix 1.

HB 2147 – LEAD pre arrest diversion – Support > Comment

JD and WT end their briefing by sharing the status of other bills of significance.

HB 2243 – Hui 'Imi Advisory Council – Oppose

HB 2276 – Water Quality Monitoring, Keaukaha – Support

HB 2473 – Tiny Homes HHFDC Appropriation – Comment

Trustees discussed SB 3090 at length. They were still inquiring as to why OHA would not have a seat on the Authority. Other Trustees were still wondering if this Authority would come under OHA. JD commented that should the Bill pass, the Mauna Kea Management Authority would likely become its own agency, but she is unsure if it will be housed under any other state department.

Trustees also discussed HB 2464 relating to the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act. Trustees had incorrect information regarding the ability to transfer a lease to another qualified native Hawaiian. JD and Monica Morris (MM) shared the correct information.

Trustees also discussed their Public Land Trust bill. JD mentioned that the bills are moving, but again shares her request that OHA share a unified message.

CL thanked JD and WT for their presentation. He also thanks the Trustees for the discussion.


