HB 1934 – Prohibit new injection wells – Support

HB 2016 – No inclusionary zoning for 140 AMI – Oppose

HB 2047 – UH IFA Manoa > Hilo – Oppose

HB 2073 – Allows county redevelopment agencies to negotiate a development agreement for commercial, business, hotel or resort uses on public lands in the redevelopment – Comment

HB 2508 – Facilities funding for infrastructure, clarify that the law allows money for this – Support with Amendments

HB 2593 – Mandate DOH register cat “caretakers”. Exempt from laws regarding feeding cats. – Oppose

HB 2661 – Hawaii County Agricultural lodges for tourists – Oppose

SB 658 – Airport Corporation Bill – Oppose

SB 1232 – No contested case hearings for land leases, extensions or consents to sublease – Oppose

SB 1303 – OHA election bill – Comment

SB 2603 – Legislative studies and reports – Monitor

SB 2999 – TVR – brokers can remit, information to counties, remove listings violating law, inform those who list these of the law – Support

SB 3090 – Mauna Kea Management Authority – Comment

Trustees thanked JD and WT for such thorough explanations of public policies proposed positions. They expect it to continue throughout the Legislative session of 2018.

General questions such as who sponsored bills or if there were any other major significances of the bills to which Trustees should pay close attention were asked. The two bills which received the most attention were SB 3090 relating to the Mauna Kea Management Authority and SB 2593 relating to feeding cats.

For SB 3090, Trustees wanted to know why OHA was not named as a member. JD did not have an answer, but she would check.

For SB 2593, a trustee mentioned that feral cats and the feeding of feral cats is a real problem in the neighborhood. Allowing people to feed the cats may not be the answer. Euthanization may be the answer.

After the presentation concluded, CA thanked JD and WT and the rest of OHA Administration for doing a good job.
