Jocelyn Doane (JD) and Wayne Tanaka (WT) present item IV. A.

JD mentions that the package bills are doing okay. The Public Land Trust bill has a hearing on Friday in Ways and Means (WAM). Finance still needs to hold a hearing for the bill but there is still time. All of the rest of our package bills are still alive except one of the cultural reserves bills. All of them can still move if they get a hearing by March 2.
