ACTION ITEM BAE-RM #21-02: Approval to Reallocate the FY20 and FY21 Unspent Balance of Contract #3363 in the Amount of \$838,332; and Reclassify FY21 Unencumbered Sponsorships of \$205,921; for the Combined Purpose to Award a Grant of \$1,044,253 for Emergency Financial Assistance to Hawaii Community Lending

RM Chair Waihe'e: I will turn it over to our Pouhana Sylvia Hussey.

Ka Pouhana Hussey: Thank you Chair Waihe'e; good afternoon. Trustees, this action item follows up on the February 10th action item for reallocation. At that time, Administration needed to do the work to wind down contract #3363 for Emergency Financial Aid Funds and then come back with a proposal to redistribute the funds for Beneficiary needs for Emergency Financial Assistance. The Action Item that you have in front of you is that analysis; as well as an additional recommendation to add more dollars from the sponsorship line that is on moratorium and unlikely to be used by the end of the Fiscal Year.

The recommendation is to increase and re-award the dollars for the same purpose of Emergency Financial Assistance to a contractor that has been named there. The background information of that contractor, the reason for the selection of the contractor as well as additional due diligence and conflict information is there for the Trustees as well. We have online with us Maile Lu'uwai, our Grants Manager who can also answer any of the questions that you may have as it relates to this particular Action Item and recommendation being brought forward by Administration to the Trustees. With that, we'll stand with any questions.

RM Chair Waihe'e: Are there any questions members?

There are zero questions.

Trustee Hulu Lindsey: I'd like to make a motion to reallocate the Fiscal Year 20 and Fiscal Year 21 unspent balance of Contract #3363 in the amount of \$838,332.00 for the purpose of an Aggregated Emergency Financial Assistance Grant Award.

I'd like to also add to this motion that these monies will be going to Hawai'i Community Lending. Correct Sylvia?

Pouhana Hussey: That's correct Board Chair. RM Chair Waihe'e, Administration is recommending that the Board take each of the three motions separately because each motion has a very specific action that we're asking of the Trustees and want to keep all of the Authorization pieces separate.

I apologize that it may require six roll call votes; but it's important that Administration be clear - and the Trustees are clear to what authorizations are being given to be able to implement; hence the three motions.

- One is to reallocate from the contract.
- The second is to re-purpose the sponsorship dollars to granting dollars.
- The third motion is to award an unsolicited but approve contract to Hawai'i Community Lending.

Again, Administration apologizes for the three separate motions, but it's important that it be presently clear what *Actions and Authorities* the trustees have directed Administration to implement.

RM Chair Waihe'e: OK, that's fine. There was a motion made, is there a second?

Trustee Hulu Lindsey: No, John. The motion on the board could you please add that this award will be given to Hawai'i Community Lending. It's not the motion on the board, but it was my oral addition that I want it to say. I want to add that this award will be given to Hawai'i Community Lending because that's not made clear here.

Trustee Lee: Without objection, I would like to move for both the RM and the BAE committees to award the combined total of \$1,044,253 to contract with Hawai'i Community Lending for the purpose of an Emergency Financial Assistance Grant Award.

Ka Pouhana Hussey: So, the motions were set up to be acted separately and the combined \$1,044,253 is the total of \$838,332 in motion one and \$205,921 in motion two.

Trustee Hulu Lindsey: And the first 2 motions were for Emergency Financial Assistance?

Pouhana Hussey: Yes.

Trustee Hulu Lindsey: I believe that because I added the Hawai'i Community Lending to the first motion and did not add it to the second; the motion should be for the \$205,921.

Trustee Lee: Put all 3 motions up so everybody can see them.

RM Chair Waihe'e: At worst though, you're just repeating yourself twice. I don't know what the harm is in passing the motion as it's written.

Trustee Hulu Lindsey: It's overstating, it's adding up to more money than we have.

Trustee Lee: Point of clarification, Mr. Chair.

RM Chair Waihe'e recognizes Trustee Lee.

Trustee Lee: I do not believe that's correct because motion one says oh sorry it went back up - I can't see it anymore. It says to reallocate unspent balance... I understand what the Chief of Staff is saying.

It can be read that way that we did award it already because it says this award will be given to Hawai'i Community Lending. The original motion just says to reallocate, it doesn't say who to give it to.

The third motion's purpose was to identify who the award was going to.

Trustee Hulu Lindsey: So, we can avoid the third motion, because we covered it in the first two. I think we need to amend the motion.

RM Motion – AMENDMENT (1:59 p.m.)

Trustee Lee: Can we get all three motions up again.

I would like to amend my main motion to remove \$1,044,253 and insert instead \$205,921.

Trustee Hulu Lindsey: That's correct I second that.

Trustee Lee: And, without objection Mr. Chair - may I request the BAE committee chair accept the motion as well - so that I can cast my vote simultaneously? Thank you, Mr. Chair.

B. Unexpended Funds-Allocation to Iwi Kupuna Repatriation & Reinterment Grant and Homestead Community Grant

Grant reviewers agreed that eight applications should not be funded. These applications failed to provide sufficient information regarding events to support OHA funding.

The scores for the eight applications ranged from 66% to 45%. As a result, of the \$200,000 in 'Ahahui Grant funds available, \$51,314 in funds are unexpended.

[1] - When the solicitation applications were submitted, Grants Manager Maile Lu'uwai was on the Board of 'O Maku'u ke Kahua Community Center. Lu'uwai was not in attendance at board meetings where the grant was discussed and was not aware that the organization planned to submit an OHA grant application. Thus, she was not included in their board's decision making and application process for this grant. Lu'uwai was also not involved in OHA's decision making or scoring process for the award recommendation. The award recommendation is based on the scores from external grant reviewers. Prior to the BOT review and action, Lu'uwai resigned from the organization's board to ensure that there are no conflicts upon award and contracting for this applicant.

The additional funds increase the applicant's recommended award to \$53,095 (\$25,000 + \$28,095). Applicant's original funding request was \$75,000.

Administration notes: When the solicitation applications were submitted, Grants Manager Maile Lu'uwai was on the Board of 'O Maku'u ke Kahua Community Center. Lu'uwai was not in attendance at board meetings where the grant was discussed and was not aware that the organization planned to submit an OHA grant application. Thus, she was not included in their board's decision making and application process for this grant. Lu'uwai was also not involved in OHA's decision making or scoring process for the award recommendation. The award recommendation is based on the scores from external grant reviewers. Prior to the BOT review and action, Lu'uwai resigned from the organization's board to ensure that there are no conflicts upon award and contracting for this applicant.
