



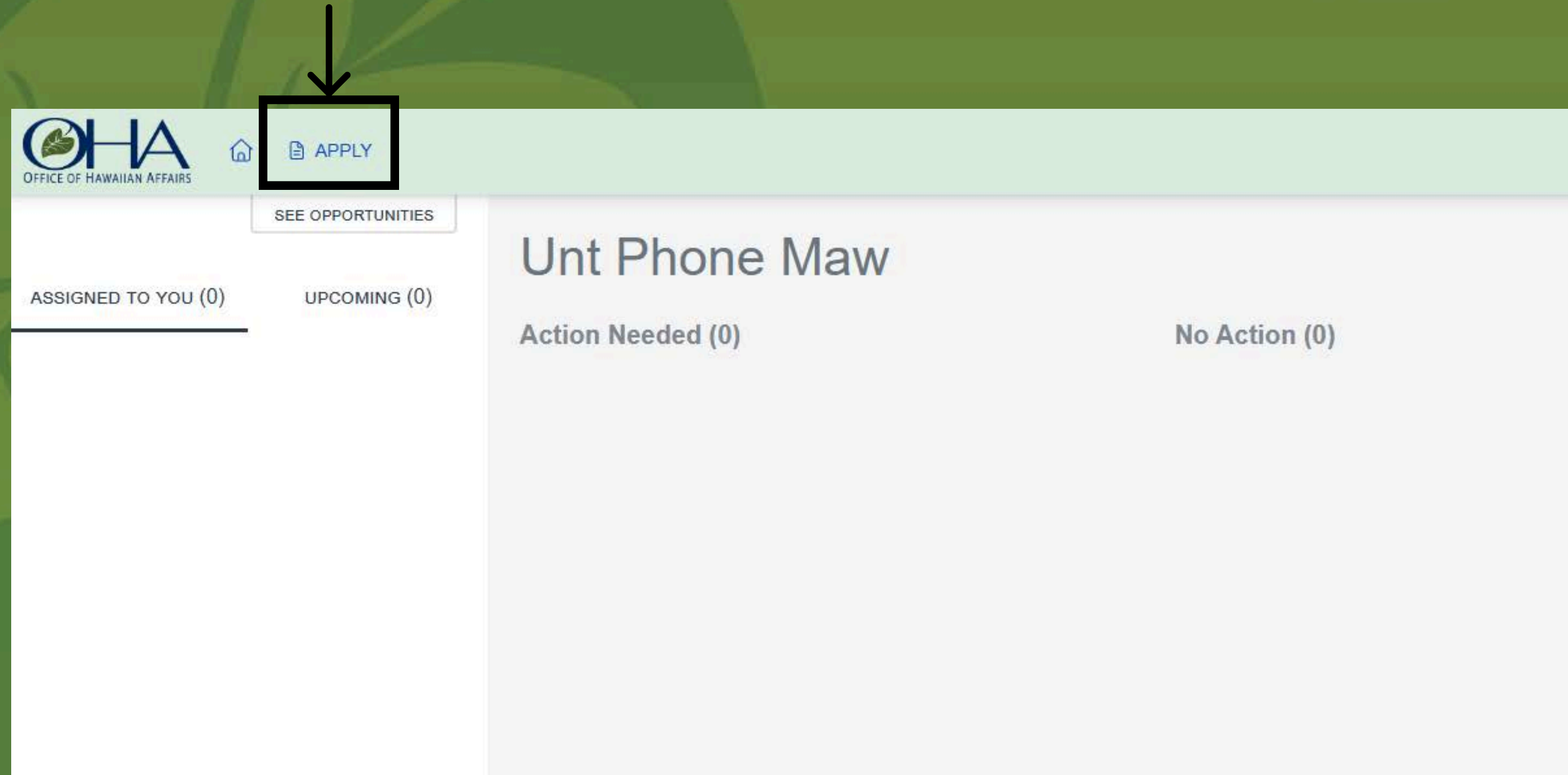

The 'Īna'i Kōkua Gift Card Program provides support in the form of a **\$2,000 Home Depot gift card** to **Native Hawaiian individuals and 'ohana** impacted by the March 10 – 24, 2026 Kona Low storm events in the City and County of Honolulu, Maui County, and Hawai'i County. This gift card is intended to address unmet disaster-related needs in alignment with the Office of Hawaiian Affairs' commitment to Mana i Maoli Ola, through equitable access to recovery.

- Are a verified Native Hawaiian beneficiary of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs as demonstrated by an unexpired Hawaiian Registry Program (HRP) card. If you do not have a current HRP card, please apply online at [Hawaiian Registry Program - The Office of Hawaiian Affairs \(OHA\)](#).
- Reside in a FEMA-designated disaster area.
- Experienced direct impacts or losses from the Kona Low storms.

- Proof of Residency (2 documents)
