Eligibility - MHDF Grant

The **Mālama Honua Disaster Fund (MHDF) Program** provides habitability repair grants for Native Hawaiian homeowners in identified areas that were highly impacted by the Kona Low storms who experienced minor damage to their homes. The grant is for smaller scale habitability repairs averaging \$10,000 per grant. The program is open to OHA beneficiary homeowners not otherwise eligible for I Ola funding who provide verifiable quotes or invoices for habitability repairs

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Minor damage means the residence has non-structural damage and needs repair but is currently safe to live in.

ELIGIBILITY
MHDF grant funding will be distributed to qualified OHA beneficiary homeowners who meet all of the eligibility criteria below:

1. Applicant must be Native Hawaiian (HRP verification required);
2. Applicant must own the impacted residence;
3. The impacted residence must have been the applicant's principal residence at the time of the Kona Low storms;
4. The impacted residence must be located within an OHA-identified area that was highly impacted by the Kona Low storms;
5. Applicant must have experienced minor damage to the impacted residence due to the Kona Low storms;
6. Applicant must provide verifiable quotes, invoices, or other cost documentation acceptable to OHA for home repair or cleanup costs necessitated by the Kona Low storms; and
7. Applicant must submit a current, complete, and accurate W-9 form.

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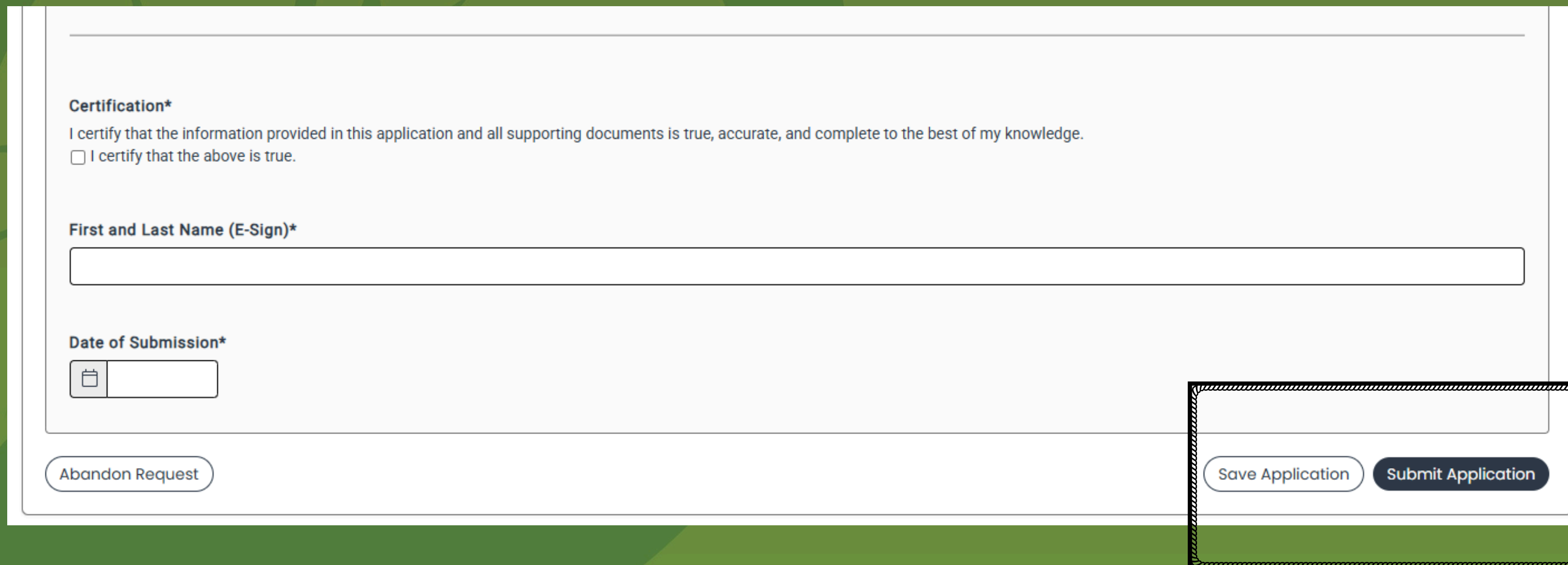
